David Salo suggested prefixal an- might generally convert adjectives to adverbs in his book Gateway to Sindarin (GS/140), but I suspect this is more properly a prepositional formation and the preposition used would depend on context. Sindarin also has dedicated adverbs, such as mae "well", palan "far", sí "here", hí "now".

Sindarin plurals are characterised by i-affection, or umlaut (see also prestanneth "affection of vowels"). Almost all Sindarin words form their plurals like English man/men and goose/geese - by changing the vowels in the word. The plural patterns are: Note that ai can sometimes become î (or, less commonly, ý).
