The sixth edition provides explicit rules for direct quotations and states that you must credit the source when "paraphrasing, quoting an author directly, or describing an idea that influenced your work" (p. 170). If the quotation is less than 40 words, incorporate the quotation into the text and place quotation marks round the quotation.

Your reference list should be ordered alphabetically by author and then chronologically by year of publication. The APA 6th style requires the references to be indented as illustrated below in the examples. For instances of multiple articles with the same authors and years of publication, please check the APA publication manual or Academic Writer. If you have the DOI for the journal article, you should include it in the reference, otherwise, it is not nec essary.

At AUT we use the APA reference style (6th edition) to format references. In-text citations and a reference list are the two components of the APA referencing style. With anything that you have read, used and referred to in your academic writing, you must: acknowledge in text (i.e. in the work / assignment/ essay you are writing) include in your reference list (i.e. the list at the end of your work of all the sources you refer to)

This guide is based on the "Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association" 6th edition (2010). **About APA 6th—APA 6th referencing style—Library Guides—**

All references cited in the text must appear in the reference list, except for personal communications (such as conversations or emails) which cannot be retrieved. A bibliography is different from a reference list as it lists all the sources used during your research and background reading, not just the ones you refer to in your writing.
