CHOPIN THE TEACHER In 1832, Fryderyk Franciszek Chopin (1810-1849) successfully debuted as a pianist in Paris and began a lifetime occupation of teaching piano and composing. He interacted with the intellectuals and aristocrats of Paris and became an important piano teacher.

Chopin the Teacher - Piano

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His numerous works on Chopin include studies on Chopin's compositions and stylistic devices and contributions to the composer's biography. Eigeldinger is also the editor of texts dealing with Chopin's work as a piano teacher. In 1993 Eigeldinger published Chopin's sketches for a piano teaching method.
