*Dying to Eat, Eating to Die: Learning to Survive ...*

As a person enters the dying process, months before death occurs, they will gradually stop eating. Months before death they will stop eating meats, then fruits and vegetables, then soft foods, then liquids and finally in the days before death they will not even take water. This is normal. This is how people die.

The shift to ketone production by the liver is what allows humans to survive a duration without food. 2 ? Once the fatty acid reserves are depleted, the only source of fuel available is protein (from your muscles). As protein breakdown accelerates, there is a loss of heart, kidney, and liver function, which ultimately leads to a person's demise.

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## *How Long Can You Live Without Food?*

A person can live for a very long time without eating, but dehydration (lack of fluids) speeds up the process. VSED is ultimately a process of dehydrating the body. Dying from a lack of food alone can be prolonged and more uncomfortable than dying from dehydration.

## *Voluntarily Stopping Eating and Drinking (VSED ...*

Rule of thumb: offer food and fluid, but if refused, do not force. Frequent oral care such as lubricating the lips, cleaning and moistening the mouth, and offering ice chips and sips of water, is very comforting. As the desire for food diminishes in dying patients, the need to feed the spirit increases.

## *Signs of death: 11 symptoms and what to expect*

Forcing someone to eat can cause choking or aspiration. This is when the person “inhales” food or fluids into the lungs. This can be painful. It can cause many of the same symptoms such as shortness of breath and coughing.

## *Why It's OK for Your Loved One to Stop Eating and Drinking ...*

If a person stops eating or drinking because of their reduced appetite, this may be hard to accept, but it is a normal part of the dying process. If they stop drinking, their mouth may look dry, but this does not always mean they are dehydrated. It is normal for all dying people eventually to stop eating and drinking.

## *Body changes at the end of life | NHS inform*

You can live for a long time without eating, but dehydration (lack of fluids) speeds up the dying process. Dying from dehydration is generally not uncomfortable once the initial feelings of thirst subside. If you stop eating and drinking, death can occur as early as a few days, though for most people, approximately ten days is the norm.

## *Other Options to Hasten Your Death*

Several weeks before death, your loved one may start exhibit a range of behavioral changes relating to their sleeping patterns, eating habits and sociability. They may begin to sleep more often and for longer periods. They will start to refuse foods that are difficult to eat or digest, but eventually they will refuse all solid foods.

Difficulty in swallowing, eating and drinking leads to weight loss, dehydration, and malnutrition, which further increases her vulnerability to infection. 4. In the end, most people with late-stage dementia die of a medical complication related to their underlying dementia. For instance, a person may die from an infection like aspiration pneumonia, which occurs as a result of swallowing difficulties, or a person may die from a blood clot in the lung as a result of being immobile and bedbound.

Have a regular meal and snack schedule Having a regular daily routine and serving food at roughly the same times every day helps their body be ready to eat at those times. Don't rely on your older adult's ability to feel their hunger (it declines with age) before giving them food.

A dying patient's needs for food and water are far different from those of a healthy, active person. As the end of life nears, the body gradually loses its ability to digest and process foods and liquids. As organs and bodily functions shut down, minimal amounts of nutrition or hydration/liquids might be needed, if at all.

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body through the tube.

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
