The GFSI TWG defines food safety cultures as, "shared values, beliefs and norms that affect mind- set and behaviour toward food safety in, across and throughout an organization." The definition is derived from existing literature on organizational and food safety culture and made practical and applicable through the group's work.

Griffith's definition of food safety culture is, "the set of dominant and relatively constant beliefs, values and attitudes that are apprehended and shared and that contribute to food hygiene behaviors practiced in an environment (organization) where manipulation occurs food".
