Anselm's Reply to Gaunilo Anselm in turn wrote a Reply to Gaunilo in which he defended his argument that God must exist because he cannot be thought not to exist. Anselm admits that it is only true of 'that-than-which-nothing-greater-can-be-thought' that it cannot be thought not to exist.

How to argue graciously: Anselm of Canterbury and Gaunilo ...

Gaunilo claims that Anselm's dependence in his argument on a definition of God as 'that than which nothing greater can be conceived' is flawed, as we simply cannot hold such a definition. Furthermore, to have this notion of God's nature in one's mind, as Anselm claims, would also be impossible for our reason.

It is quite reasonable to worry that Anselm's argument illegitimately moves from the existence of an idea to the existence of a thing that corresponds to the idea.
