Both types of abortion may be used at any stage of pregnancy. If you are less than 7 weeks pregnant, a medical abortion is more likely to work than a surgical abortion.

Most women are well afterwards. There is no evidence that having an abortion reduces your chances of having a family when the time is right.

Medical and surgical abortions are both safe and effective when performed by trained practitioners. Most women seeking abortion are white (53%); 36% are black, 8% are of another race, and 3% are of unknown race. Abortion rates are highest among 20- to 24-year-old women.

Depending on how many weeks you have been pregnant, the pregnancy can be ended by taking medication or by having a surgical procedure.
