In early 1845, shortly after he had been expelled from France, Marx penned his famous “ Eleventh Thesis on Feuerbach ” : “ The philosophers have only interpreted the world in various ways; the point, however, is to change it. ”
1 The Theses were notes he jotted down in preparation for writing The German Ideology with Friedrich Engels, which set out their materialist conception of history (later called historical materialism), but all this work remained unpublished during Marx ’ s lifetime.
