PRUDENCE. Prudence is one of the four cardinal virtues . Like the other three, it is a virtue that can be practiced by anyone; unlike the theological virtues , the cardinal virtues are not, in themselves, the gifts of God through grace but the outgrowth of habit. However, Christians can grow in the cardinal virtues through sanctifying grace, and thus prudence can take on a supernatural dimension as well as a natural one.

Prudence, along with fortitude and temperance, is a major or cardinal virtue upon which other virtues depend for their direction and perfection. Whereas fortitude and temperance deal with our passions or sense appetites, prudence deals with our intellect and is rightly called an intellectual virtue.

Prudence, the "mother" of all of the virtues, is the virtue by which a person recognizes his moral duty and the good means to accomplish it. Actually, prudence is part of the definition of goodness. A person can be prudent and good only simultaneously. No other virtue can contradict what is prudent.
